Basic Course

Eligibility

Special educators, School counselors and Teachers who are keen to look at gifted education can participate. Parents may also join as they would benefit from it.

Outcome of the Basic Course

- Sensitization towards Giftedness
- Identification of gifted children in the classroom
- Assigning small exercises in class to gifted children
- Creating an enriching environment in the classroom

Advanced Course

Eligibility

The advanced level is open for all those who have successfully completed the Basic Course as well as for those who have worked with Gifted children for a few years as teachers, parents or counselors.

Outcome of the Advanced Course

- Insight into motivation and the thought process of gifted children
- Independently designing activities for gifted in integrated classrooms
- Mentoring gifted children in vision building for their future careers
- Facilitating gifted children to achieve balance between academic and emotional needs.

Course requirements

Submissions of regular assignments and group work are compulsory for evaluation.

Presentation of work in the group for collaborative learning will also be a part of the course.

Certification

On successful completion of the course the participant will be awarded a certificate from Kaveri Gifted Education Center

Methodology

Discussion, debates, case studies, reading assignments, presentations, activities, and lectures.

Pre-assessment

This is a requisite to be able to assess the participant's level of knowledge.

Time Frame: 4 full day course
